EQUIPMENT OPERATOR: JOB DESCRIPTION

Primary Purpose:

Responsible for the safe and efficient operation of multiple pieces of construction equipment on different terrain for the purpose of maintenance, design and construction of both natural and physically built environments.

Training/Competency Requirements:

Level 1: Employment industry related experience required on piece of heavy-duty equipment. Class 1 or 3 with air endorsement is an asset in this role.

Equipment operation: Able to run packer and any small equipment, i.e.: bobcat, etc.

Level 2: Successfully completed and showcased expertise in level 1 duties and responsibilities; completed an accredited program or acquired the work experience equivalent (commonly 2080 hours on piece of heavy-duty equipment). Class 1 or 3 with air endorsement is an asset in this role.

Equipment operation: Able to operate smaller equipment, i.e.: rock trucks, track hoes, rubber tire hoes, water trucks, etc.

Level 3: Successfully completed and showcased expertise in level 2 duties and responsibilities; completed an accredited program or acquired the work experience equivalent (commonly 4160 hours on piece of heavy-duty equipment).

Equipment operation: Able to operate smaller equipment and industry related experience operating large equipment, i.e. dozer or excavator.

Level 4: Successfully completed and showcased expertise in level 3 duties and responsibilities; completed an accredited program or acquired the work experience equivalent (commonly 6240 hours or more).

Equipment operation: Able to operate 50 -350 class excavators, grader and dozers. Ability to mainline and competent and experienced digging around underground utilities and in constricted areas.

Through Acres performance management system, as an Equipment Operator you will receive 30 day, 80 day and biannual performance reviews which are based on the companies guiding principles of being on time, on budget, happy client, while demonstrating core values.

Primary Functions:

Responsibilities and Duties

- Operate assigned equipment in a safe and productive manner
- Inspect the vehicles to ensure safety
- Identify and coordinate with mechanic in the repair and maintenance of the construction vehicles
- Must work outdoors in different weather conditions and on varying terrain
- Complete required paperwork, reporting, and other documentation
- Complete tasks similar in capabilities as directed by supervisor
- Must complete daily equipment maintenance

Working Conditions

- Constantly sit and drive/operate assigned equipment
- Exposure to asphalt and concrete dust
- Carry out tasks under unpredictable outdoor condition and in urban areas

Physical Requirements

- Take frequent rest breaks from sitting and static grip forces required to operate the equipment
- Ability to climb approximately two steps (approx. one meter high) to enter/exit equipment
